There is nothing more satisfying than attaining your goals, and for the past seven years, Bridging the Digital Divide, has created a Computer Olympics Academic Excellence Program that has as objectives: eradicate illiteracy and expand computer know-how and access and to donate Internet-ready refurbished computers and lap-tops to Houston area Child Development Centers, After-School Programs, Church Organizations as well as community-based (non-profit) organizations in general. BDD's primary goal with the Computer Olympics is to encourage students and school organizations to utilize computers for academic skills and academic excellence.

The Computer Olympics provides opportunities for children from ages 2 – 12 to compete in the areas of math, science, spelling, social studies, keyboarding, flag identification and memory tests.
